M. **Dr. Levi Brown's Update** - Stuff the Squad was a great success! Thank you to all who participated in bringing donations for those in need. We are working on: Diversity, Equity and Inclusion all year long in the MRC and within our morning announcements and possibly with guest speakers. MRC will have books that have themes and authors that celebrate: Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. Recently, we were lucky enough to have a D181 guest speaker such as Rakeda Leaks, (Naperville District 203 appointed her the Director of Diversity and Inclusion).

1. **8th Grade Graduation Update-** It's an in-person graduation, held at the Westmont Park District Athletic Field. We will be decorating and sharing space with HMS. The last day of school is June 8th for the 8th graders and then June 10th is their graduation. June 8th they will receive gift cards for ice cream and pizza. The kids can sign yearbooks on June 8th and then the formal graduation event is June 10th. Four family attendees are allowed, plus the graduate. The families will be set up socially distanced.
2. **The Rotary Run** sign up begins now for the October 3, 2021 race.

N. **General Meeting Votes:**

1. **Encore Purchases** - Items purchased for the Encores included Family Consumer Science, Art/Digital Media, and Applied Tech classes: \$6,938 will be spent on specific items in need. Thanks to the generous support of our CHMS community, \$1,402 still remains in our fundraising budget.
2. With your vote and approval, the following additional items will be directly available to the students by using the balance left

from the year and by asking to use the left owner grade level supply budgets to benefit: 6th, 7th and 8th graders alike in the MRC.

3. A motion to vote for the capital expenditure of the mobile shelves, (2) sets of end panels, canopy top, and installation and freight: \$2,994.00. The additional dollars needed (\$1402) were found in grade level supplies and support budgets. In order to confirm the above spending was made with a proper vote; a motion was made to approve the above spending and motion was approved.
4. **2021-22 CHMS PTO Board** - The Executive Board would like to recommend the following slate for a vote:
 - a) Vice Presidents: OPEN
 - b) Secretary: Lindsay Patel
 - c) Assistant Treasurer: Elaine Gilman
 - d) VP of Communications: Megan Maduri
 - e) There were no other nominations from the floor.
 - (1) There was a vote to approve the aforementioned slate. There was a request to vote with your hand for all those who say YAY or NAY. There were all 'YAY' votes. The slate was ratified and approved.
5. **2021-2022 CHMS PTO Budget** - was presented to the General Meeting Attendees and posted on our website. The PTO Board and Treasurers have recommended increasing the budget for Teacher Appreciation and Landscaping. The suggested increases were: \$600-to-\$900 for the Landscaping budget and \$3500-to-\$4500 for Teacher Appreciation budget so we can reach all those who serve our school and children: faculty, staff, bus drivers and crossing guards. There was a motion to approve the newly proposed budget and the budget was approved.
6. **Guest Speaker Dr. Garcia & Short Q&A** - Our PTO's are second to none in the area and we thank you all for your hard work. Your schools took the challenges and ran with them! Student attendance is currently at 95% and we hope to have full in person attendance back next year.
 - a) The amount of social distance is being reviewed from 6 feet to 3 feet.
 - b) The quarantine guidelines have changed and differed between the elementary and the high school level

students. One mom from the crowd, offered that Fridays are a better start date for a quarantine than a Monday so they have the weekends in there.

- c) Dr. Garcia said in 2021-2022, we are looking hard at bringing back normalcy with Physical Education, Music and Lunch.
- d) Sports and other after curriculars are due to come back next year.
- e) The surveillance testing has had a low turnout across the district and low turn-in rate too.
- f) Dr. Garcia is hopeful for a great 2021-2022 and is very proud of CHMS and all of the schools in D181 and their accomplishments under Covid restraints.
